Citizens Report Card Education Charsadda



Citizens Report Card-Education-Charsadda

This Citizen Report Card is an attempt to provide citizens' feedback about availability and quality of educational facilities in District Charsadda. The survey results show that about 55% of the respondents are not satisfied with the toilet facilities available at the school, 20% not satisfied with the drinking water facility; 25% not satisfied with the school building and 19% not satisfied with the school maintenance. About 46% are not satisfied with the extracurricular activities at school.

For majority of the respondents, school is located within 1 km radius of the residence. 87% of the respondents told that the school had boundary wall. 9% respondent told school had a broken boundary wall, whereas 2% respondents told that there was no boundary wall at all. 93% of the respondents told their children's school had a lavatory with a vast majority told that the lavatory was supplied with running water.

 $6\,\%$ of respondents told that there was no source of drinking water at school. 57% respondents told that alternate source of water was available within 100m radius of the school and students were the main means of fetching the water from outside of the school. Only 77% respondents told that school had a playground.


According to majority of respondents, Classroom furniture was available. Over 90% respondents told that teachers' tables and chairs were available at classroom. However, this percentage decreased for students. 77% respondents told that students had chairs in the class room whereas 68% told that students had table in classroom. Black/white board was available according the 91% of the respondents. 93% respondents confirmed that ceiling fans were available in the classrooms. Only 47% confirmed that student attendance board was available at school.

The implementation of Article 25-A of the constitution of Pakistan remained poor. The article says that "The State shall provide free and compulsory education to all children of the age of five to sixteen years in such manner as may be determined by law." Only 74% respondents confirmed that free textbooks were available to the students. 6% of the respondents also confirmed that they had paid fee regularly to the school. Another 7% told that tuition fee was paid to school during some months of the year. 24% respondents told that they had paid fee/donation other than the tuition fee during the last one year. The relationship between parents and teacher remained weak during the last year. 65% respondents told that there was no parent-teachers meeting held during last one year.

26% respondents told that their children complained at least once in the last one year about the absence of the teacher. Of 26% of the respondents complaining about absence of teacher; 9% told students complained about absence of teacher in last 1 year for more than 5 times during the last one year.


Q1: How far (in meter) is school from your home?


Q2: What mode of transport your child use to reach school?


Q3: Is this school situated within the boundaries of same union council where you live?


Q4: In last one year, has the child ever missed the school?

Q5: What are the reasons for missing the schools? (Check all that apply)




Q6: Does the school has boundary wall?


Q7: Since how long the boundary wall is broken?


Q8: Does the school has a lavatory?


Q9: Is the lavatory supplied with running tap water?


Q10: What is the source of water supply in school?


Q11: Is there any arrangement for fetching water from outside school?


Q12: How far is the water source from school?


Q13: How long does it take in (minutes) to fetch water and return to school?


Q14: Who fetches water to school?


Q15: Does the school has a playground?


Q16: Which of the sport facilities available at school? (Check all that apply)


Q17: Is proper classroom available for the students in school?


Q18: Is chair for teacher available in class?


Q19: Is table for teacher available in class room?


Q20: Is chair for student available in classroom?


Q21: Is table for student available in class room?


Q22: Is Blackboard/white board available in class room?


Q23: Is student attendance board available?

Q24: Is ceiling fan available in class room?




Q25: has your child been provided all the text books free?


Q26: In last one year, how many parent/teacher meetings were held at school?


Q27: Does School Charge monthly fee (tuition fee) to the students?



Q29: Which learning activities from available at school? (check all that apply)




Q30: In last one year, did your child ever complained about absence of teacher at school?

Q31: How many time did the child complain about the absence of teacher in last one year?




Q32: Satisfaction level of the facilities available at School


Q33: Satisfaction level of the school location

Methodology

- Focus group Discussion (FGD): FGD was held at district level. Through FGD, the most pressing problem of the district was identified. The identified problem was selected as the topic of Citizen Report Card.
- Designing of Questionnaire: The questionnaire was designed based on the different aspect discussed during the FGD. The questionnaire was beta tested before actual execution of survey.
- 3. Sample Size: Depending upon the time and resources available, a sample size of 200 households was taken from randomly selected 8 wards of the district. (25 households from each selected ward). The wards were randomly selected through an online facility https://www.randomizer.org.
- 4. Survey Team: The survey was conducted by a team of 6 trained surveyors/enumerators. The team was supervised by a trained supervisor who not only monitored the survey activity but also cross checked the filled survey forms for accuracy and consistency. The survey was coordinated by the local partner Saiban Development Organization.
- 5. Execution of Survey: Phase 1: A) Survey was started in selected wards by visiting the household in the selected ward. The first household was selected closest to the predecided reference point (UC/Ward's office or any other prominent place). B) Survey was completed at first household and afterwards every 6th household was selected till 13 households are covered.
 - Phase 2: A) The enumerator approached to the main mosque or any other prominent place of the ward. The Household closest to the reference point was selected for first survey. After first survey, every 6th household was selected till 12 households are covered. Thus, the survey was completed in 25 households in a ward.
- 6. Respondent: Interview was conducted with head of the household; in case of unavailability, interview was conducted with the oldest adult member present at the time of survey. In case of unavailability of respondent or unwillingness of the respondent to participate in the survey, the surveyor skipped five households to conduct the next household interview.
- 7. Report Writing: The analysis was generated through the online survey facility, Survey Monkey (www.surveymonkey.com). All the data was entered in the survey monkey with the help of volunteers and CPDI staff and analysis was generated.
